

Interactive Notebook Guidelines

The purpose of the interactive notebook is to:

- Organize notes, class work, and homework
- Involve students in "making sense" of their notes
- Develop visual aids for learning
- Create a personalized History Textbook and study guide.

Materials Needed:

- Spiral Notebook, Pens, Highlighters, Colored Pencils, Ruler

Notebook Organization:

Left Side - Students Process Information	Right Side - Teacher Provides Information
<p>The left side belongs to you!</p> <p>These assignments will ask you to present the information we process in class in a new and meaningful way. Friendly Reminders:

- Make sure assignments match the table of contents - Ms. Armstrong will not search for your assignment.
- No pages should be torn from your notebook, EVER!
- Homework should be completed outside your notebook. It will be added after scoring.
- Use color - the notebook is a visual study tool!
- Your notebook needs to be in class every day if it is to be useful

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
